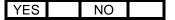

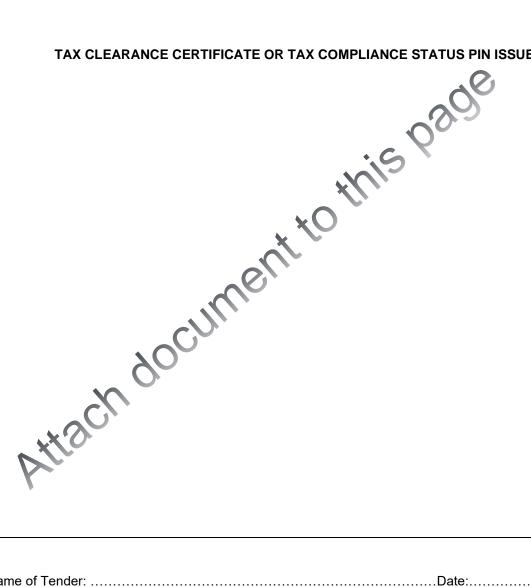

then endeavour to rectify the situation and will inform the Supply Chain Management Unit to ensure that comparable bids are received. Such information should reach the municipality within reasonable time before the closing date for the proposals.

Claims for extra work payments as a result of omissions in the request for proposals by the successful contractor will not be entertained.

C3. 5.1: UBUNTU LOCAL MUNICIPALITY TENDER CONDITIONS AND INFORMATION

1. General and special conditions of contract

The general conditions of contract (GCC) as well as special conditions of contract (SCC) forming part of this set of tender documents will be applicable to this tender in addition to the conditions of tender. Where the GCC and SCC are in conflict with one another, the stipulations of the SCC will prevail.

2. Acceptance or Rejection of a tender

The municipality reserves the right to withdraw any invitation to tender and/or to re-advertise or to reject any tender or to accept part of it. The municipality does not bind itself to accepting the lowest tender or the tender scoring the highest points. The municipality reserves the right to waive any requirements as contained in the bid conditions and or specifications.

3. Validity Period

Bids shall remain valid for ninety (90) days after the tender closure date.

4. VAT

Price(s) quoted must be firm and must be inclusive of VAT.

5. Registration on central supplier database

It is expected of all prospective service providers who are not yet registered on the central supplier database to register without delay on the prescribed form. The municipality reserves the right not to award tenders to prospective suppliers who are not registered on the database.

6. Completion of Tender Documents

- a) The original tender document must be <u>completed fully in black ink</u> and signed by the authorised signatory to validate the tender. Failure to do so will result in the disqualification of the tender.
- b) Tender documents may not be retyped. Retyped documents will result in the disqualification of the tender.

c) Faxed, e-mailed and late tenders will not be accepted.

18. Evaluation of Tenders

Tenders will be evaluated in terms of their responsiveness to the tender specifications and requirements as well as such additional criteria as set out in this set of tender documents.

19. Procurement Policy

Bids will be evaluation in terms of the 80 (price) /20 (B-BBEE status) preferential point system. Bids will be awarded in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2001 pertaining to the Preferential

Procurement Policy Framework Act, No 5 of 2000 and its amendments as well as the Municipality's Supply

20. Contract

9. Packing	9.1	The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
	9.2	The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instruction ordered by the purchaser.
10. Delivery and documents	10.1 10.2	Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC. Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.
11. Insurance	11.1	The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.
12. Transportation	12.1	Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.
13. Incidental Services	13.1	 The provider may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC: a. performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods; b. furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods; c. furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods; d. performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and

		 e. training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods. Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.
14. Spare parts		 As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier: (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts: Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.
15. Warranty	15.2 15.3 15.4 15.5	The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination. This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC. The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser. If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.
16. Payment	16.1	The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.

16.2 16.3 16.4	The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract. Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier. Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.
